

Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge

The Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge was established in 1965 to provide wintering habitat for the Dusky subspecies of the Canada Goose. Today, the Refuge preserves habitat for wildlife and evidence of First Peoples. The Refuge is a unique wildlife mecca for the Vancouver/Portland metropolitan area - a wonderful place to explore, learn about, and photograph the many species that call the Refuge "home". A one-of-a-kind Chinookan-style Plankhouse has brought cultural history to life on the Refuge.
