Please note: Bicycles, off-road vehicles, & ATV driving are not permitted on the Refuge.

Entrance Fee:

- Online: NEW! Easily pay your entrance fee (or purchase an entrance pass) before you visit, by using recreation.gov.
- In-Person: \$3.00 daily per vehicle, or up to four adults on foot. Cash or check only (for now!).

Entrance Pass Options:

- Online: New! Easily buy an Annual Pass before you visit, using recreation.gov.
- In-person (or by mail): Purchase An Annual Refuge Pass or eligible Federal Lands Pass.
 - \$15.00 for an Annual Ridgefield NWR pass. Purchase at Ridgefield NWR Admin Office, M-F, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm; by mail; or place cash/check in an official fee envelope. Complete details <u>HERE</u>.

Become a Friends Member at \$60 or above.

- <u>Join here!</u> Opt-in when joining, and an Annual Refuge Pass will be mailed to you.
- **Use your current Federal Lands Pass.** Check HERE to see the list of eligible passes. Note: State Passes are *not valid for entry to the Refuge.

Prescribed Fire Planned for Bachelor Island - Two days between Sept 27 -Oct 4

Where: 80 acres of Bachelor Island, a closed unit at the Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge.

When: 2 days between Friday, September 27th and October 4th, pending weather conditions including rain and wind.

Why: To control invasive plants and encourage the growth of young grass that is preferred by geese, cranes, and white-tailed deer.

Who: Fire crews from WA Dept of Natural Resources, U.S. Forest

Service, National Park Service, and Refuge staff.

What to expect: Smoke plumes may be visible from town but will be shut down if it appears to be moving in the direction of the city.

Carty Unit Temporary Access Change

September 27 - 30: The Carty Unit access from Main Avenue will be CLOSED while asphalt is poured and allowed to cure. No vehicle access or parking at the Refuge

Administrative Office. The Office will remain closed these days.

The trails will remain open for walk-in visitation during this closure. We recommend visitors enter via the Port's Carty Lake Trail entrance or walk in from Downtown via Headquarters Trail. The River 'S' Unit and Kiwa trail will be open for all users.

BirdFest & Bluegrass Celebrating 25 Years

Join us for the highly anticipated BirdFest & Bluegrass Festival on October 5, 2024, in downtown Ridgefield and the beautiful Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge. This annual event celebrates our vibrant community and the natural wonders surrounding us.

Friday, October 4, the festivities start with a special 25th Anniversary Event at the Ridgefield Waterfront. Guests can partake in a pre-registered sunset paddle on Lake River with the City of Ridgefield's Dragon Boats, following a welcoming blessing from the Chinook Indian Nation and the Cowlitz Indian Tribe. Those not



interested in paddling but want to celebrate the anniversary may stay by the water for hot chocolate, wine, desserts, and music. An area for those under 21 will include crafts and treats. Registration is required for the paddle, and participants should arrive by 5:30 PM for a 6 PM start. Entry to the celebration will require an ID check and a \$10 fee. Reducing skyglow is a collective effort, and this is an opportunity for homeowners, building owners, and managers to reduce energy usage,


