

WHAT TO EXPECT

WHAT

Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge has used prescribed fire as a habitat management tool since 2018.

WHO

Prescribed fires are conducted by well-trained specialists who ensure that firefighter and public safety needs are met, and that the fire meets the Refuge's objectives.

WHY

We use prescribed fires in several pastures on the Bachelor Island Unit of the Refuge to reduce thatch, control weeds like tansy ragwort and reed canary grass, and encourage the growth of young grass shoots that geese, Sandhill cranes, and Columbian white-tailed deer prefer.

WHEN

The Refuge is proposing to burn up to 80 acres over a one or two day period between September 27th and October 4th.

The Auto Tour Route and hiking trails will be open as usual. It will not affect Birdfest (Oct 5th).
